

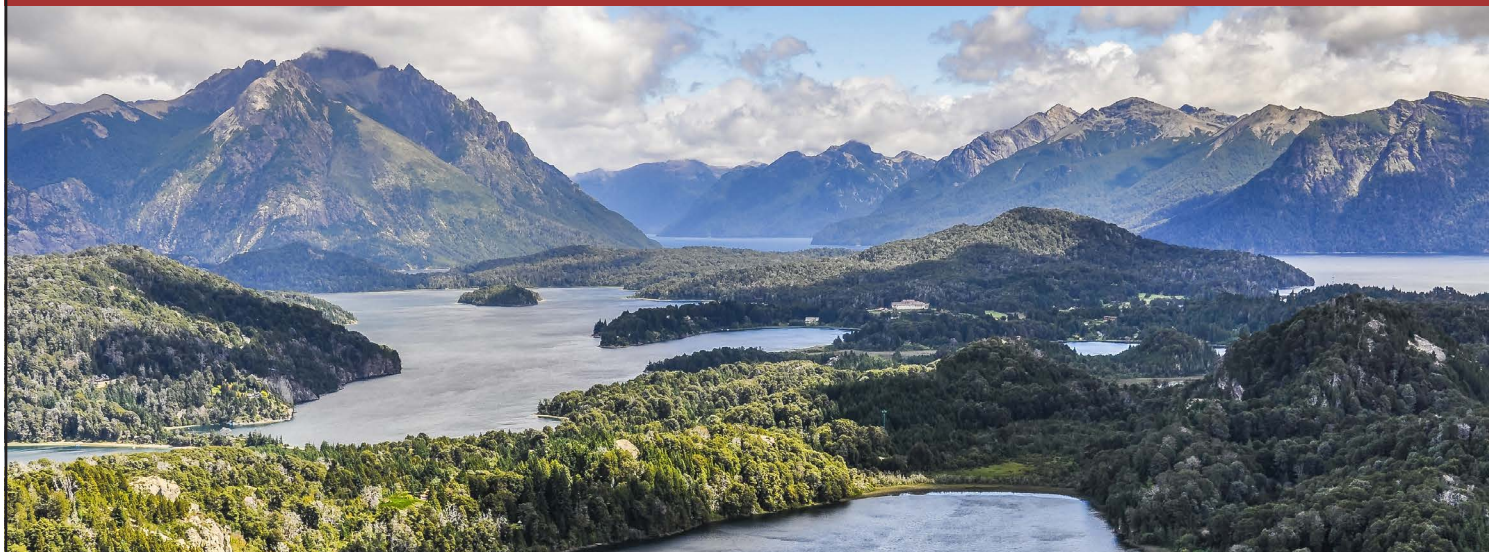

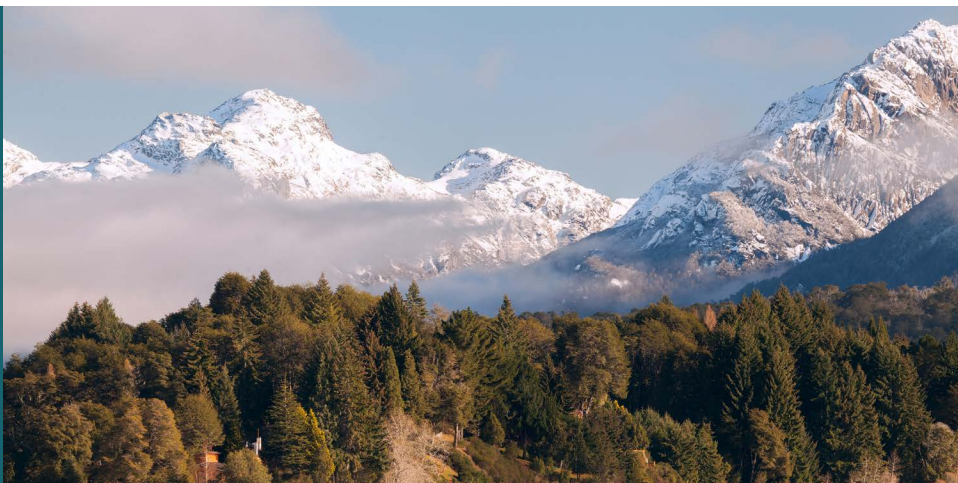

ITINERARY AT-A-GLANCE

DAY 1

Arrive in Argentina's capital city of Buenos Aires in time for a welcome dinner.

DAY 2

Buenos Aires city tour including the famously-chic Recoleta neighborhood. Dinner aboard a traditional "flatboat" as we navigate the Paraná Delta.

DAY 3

Fly to Bariloche. Afternoon walk through the native forest in Llao-Llao Nature Park. Lunch at a local brewery.

DAY 4

Boat excursion in López Bay and forest hike past waterfalls and larch trees.

DAY 5

Explore the Enchanted Valley, a secret corner of Patagonia. Transfer to the Eclipse Base Camp in the Zone of Totality. After sunset and through the night, look for signs of the Geminid meteor shower.

DAY 6

Eclipse Day followed by an optional afternoon walk or hike.

DAY 7

Fly to El Calafate in southern Patagonia; optional short sunset hike upon arrival.

DAY 8

Full day of exploration at Los Glaciares National Park and the Perito Moreno Glacier with a traditional Patagonian lunch at Estancia Nibepo Aike.

DAY 9

4x4 trip to Upsala Glacier Viewpoint and hike through Fossil Canyon.

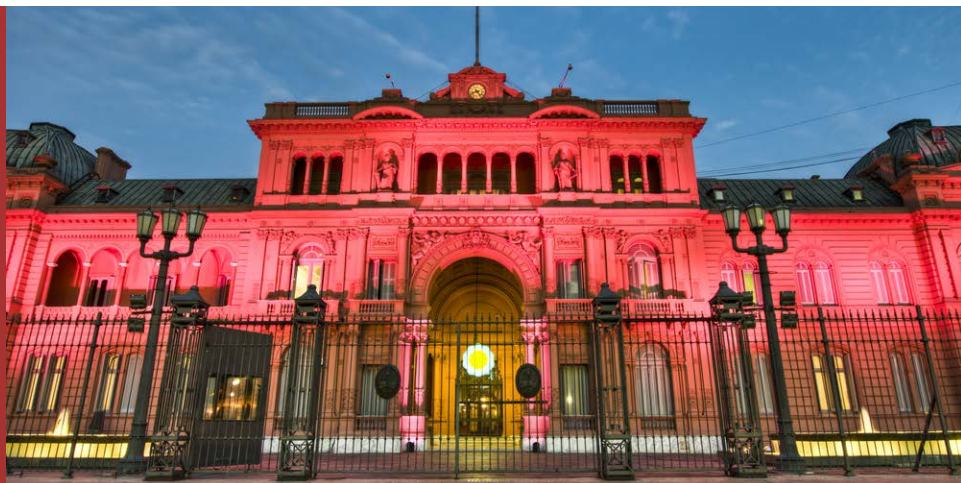

THE JOURNEY



DAY 1: Arrival in Buenos Aires

Welcome to Buenos Aires!

Upon arrival in Argentina's capital, you'll be met by a Boundless Journeys representative at the airport and transferred to your elegant, downtown hotel in Buenos Aires' Palermo Hollywood neighborhood.

Founded by Spanish explorers in the 16th century, the capital—whose name translates to “City of our Lady Saint Mary of the Fair Winds”—was an important New World trading center for more than two centuries. In 1816, following what is known as the May Revolution and several years of conflict, Argentina earned its independence from Spain. Despite two later efforts by French and Anglo-French forces to blockade the city into submission, Buenos Aires maintained its independence, and its reputation as Argentina's most liberal, free-trading, and European-influenced city continues to this day.

This afternoon, you may have time to explore Buenos Aires and the revived Palermo neighborhood on your own. There are shopping opportunities at nearby artisan markets and antique stores, and also the chance to enjoy your first taste of Argentinean beef served on an open *parrilla* barbecue. This evening, we'll enjoy a welcome dinner with our guide before retiring for the evening.

DAY 2: City Tour & Delta Navigation

Activity Overview: Walking and boating

Activity Level: Easy

Activity Length: 4-hour tour including 3 hours of walking

After breakfast, we begin our adventure with an exploration of Buenos Aires' most important historical monuments and significant buildings, such as the Casa Rosada—an iconic pink stone building that houses the office of the Argentine President. Along the way, we learn about the Porteños' lifestyle, vibrant culture, and music (“Porteño” is the name those hailing from Buenos Aires—a port city—call themselves).

We also experience the city's European flair, strolling through eclectic neighborhoods, from the historic San Telmo, to the colorful, working-class La Boca, to chic Recoleta. Among Recoleta's well-known sites is its famous cemetery, where we find the graves of many of Argentina's emblematic figures.

This evening, we have a festive dinner aboard a traditional flatboat. The Paraná Delta, where the Paraná and Uruguay rivers meet and feed the Rio de la Plata, is formed by thousands of islands, many uninhabited. More than 100 species of birds and water plants make their home here. The flatboat we will explore on was originally used to transport barrels for a distillery. It is ideal for shallow rivers and streams due to its flat bottom, hence its Spanish name, *chata palera* (meaning flat-bottomed freight boat).

DAY 3: Bariloche & Llao-Llao Nature Park

Activity Overview: Walking

Activity Level: Easy

Activity Length: 1.5 hours

Today, we take a short flight south to Bariloche. Once a little mountain village, San Carlos de Bariloche has developed into one of the most attractive small cities in Patagonia. We visit some of the key viewpoints in the city, appreciating the beauty of lakes Moreno and Nahuel Huapi and the peaks of Lopez and Capilla before stretching our legs on a walk through the impressive Llao-Llao Nature Park. To refresh ourselves after the hike, we visit a local microbrewery for a beer tasting and traditional Patagonian barbeque.

This afternoon, we are free to explore town before reconvening for dinner.

DAY 4: Tristeza Sound

Activity Overview: Walking and boating

Activity Level: Easy

Activity Length: 1.5 hours walking, about 4 hours boat tour

We continue exploring the stunning nature in this region with a boat excursion in Tristeza Sound, navigating along the most remote and least-visited branch of the Nahuel Huapi Lake. If the weather conditions are good there are beautiful views of the Tronador Mountain.

Once we reach the shore, we enjoy a forested hike among beautiful coihue and larch trees. The trail climbs to a set of beautiful waterfalls descending from the Frey River.

We enjoy lunch aboard our boat as we return to the port. The remainder of the day is free to relax at the hotel or walk around town, and dinner tonight is on your own. Bariloche has a number of good restaurants to choose from, and our guide is happy to make recommendations.

DAY 5: Enchanted Valley

Activity Overview: Walking and boating

Activity Level: Easy

Activity Length: 1.5 hours

Today, we make our way to the *Valle Encantado*, or Enchanted Valley, known for its fascinating landscape of rocky formations and vegetation that maintains its color year-round. After driving out of Bariloche, we cross the Limay River by boat and arrive in the valley. Walking among volcanic walls and caves, we enjoy the beautiful scenery of this secret corner of Patagonia.

After lunch at a local *estancia*, we head to the Eclipse Base Camp, ideally located in the Zone of Totality.

Dinner this evening is served at 7 p.m. We'll encourage an early bedtime so that if the skies are clear, you can wake around midnight to watch the peak of the Geminid meteor shower.

DAY 6: Eclipse Day

Activity Overview: Viewing and hiking

Activity Level: Easy to challenging hiking options

Activity Length: Full day

Today is the day we've been looking forward to! Breakfast is served early in order to have plenty of time to choose our personal spot on the field and set up our cameras. A mid-morning snack will be provided with fruit, croissants, and hot beverages before the eclipse begins.

As the sun moves into the moon's shadow, we will focus our attention skyward for a mesmerizing experience. Those who have seen it find it difficult to describe—day turns to night, and there is an unusual stillness. After the sun makes its way out of the shadows and daylight returns to earth, we enjoy lunch, and our group can choose how to spend the rest of the afternoon. A variety of hiking options are available right from our camp.

Dinner will be back in camp as we celebrate what we all witnessed today.

DAY 7: El Calafate

Activity Overview: Transfer, optional hike

Activity Level: Easy

Activity Length: 15-20 minutes

In the morning, we transfer to the Bariloche airport to board our flight to El Calafate in southern Patagonia.

El Calafate is on the shores of Lago Argentino in the dry and dramatic Patagonia Steppe. This area is the gateway to visit the Perito Moreno Glacier, a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Upon arrival to the hotel, we can choose to relax or explore the areas around the town on a short hike to Laguna Nimez for a beautiful Patagonian sunset.

DAY 8: Los Glaciares National Park

Activity Overview: Walking and boating

Activity Level: Easy to moderate

Activity Length: 3 hours driving, 2 hours walking, 1.5 hour boat ride

Today's itinerary features a full day of exploration in Los Glaciares National Park. Deemed a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1981, the park and its famous Perito Moreno Glacier offer some of the most awe-inspiring landscapes in Argentina, and our journey takes in the very best of the region.

Our route begins with a 31-mile drive through Santa Cruz's vast farmland, dotted by estancias, and provides a glimpse into the rural heart of southern Patagonia. We drive to Roca Lake and on to Estancia Nibepo Aike, one of the region's sheep-ranching pioneers. There, we enjoy a short hike on the property before delving into a traditional Patagonian lunch comprised of family recipes and ingredients harvested from the gardens.

We continue to the nearby port, where a short boat ride brings us to the starting point for our walk along Playa de las Monedas, or Coins Beach. There, our short hike winds through a forest of beautiful Andean lengas trees, culminating with breathtaking views of the Perito Moreno Glacier.

We return to our boat and continue south to the Bajo de las Sombras port, where a brief bus ride brings us to a series of glacier catwalks inside the National Park, where our guide describes the various faces of ice we observe. As an active glacier, portions of the ice 'calve,' or break-off, frequently, providing visitors with the opportunity to witness this rare, natural phenomenon.

We return to our inviting hotel to freshen up before our dinner of Argentinean fare and local wines.

DAY 9: Estancia Cristina

Activity Overview: Walking and nature touring

Activity Level: Moderate

Activity Length: 4-5 hours, about 8.5 miles (downhill)

After breakfast, we depart for Estancia Cristina, located in a unique corner in Los Glaciares National Park. Founded in 1941, this stunning place maintains its essence, keeping the history of its founders alive, who with great effort and perseverance, made this lonely and inhospitable place a home. From here, we take a 4x4 excursion to get to Upsala Glacier Viewpoint, where we enjoy the best views of Lake Guillermo, the face of Upsala Glacier, and the Patagonian Ice Field.

We depart for our hike through the Fossil Canyon. At 170 million years old, this place has been so named for its incredible concentration of marine fossils—imprints of squid and jellyfish among them. Although over eight miles, the entire hike is downhill as we make our way on foot back to the estancia.

We return to El Calafate, and you are free to dine independently this evening.

Activity Overview: Transfer

We say goodbye today to the beauty of Patagonia and fly back to Buenos Aires. The remainder of the day is at your leisure before we gather for our farewell dinner to toast our celestial and terrestrial adventures!

DAY 11: Departure

This morning, we are transferred to the Buenos Aires airport in time for our flights home or continued travels.

Camping facilities include: spacious dome tents (4-person size for two people to use), sleeping bags, air mattresses, lanterns, catered meals, communal dining tents, and tented toilet facilities.

WHAT TO EXPECT



TRIP RATING

Boundless Journeys' trips are designed for energetic and flexible individuals who like to be active and have a spirit of adventure and a positive attitude. *Argentina: Solar Eclipse Adventure* is rated 2, easy to moderate, on a scale of 1-5 (with 5 being the most strenuous). Walking and hiking is on well-maintained trails and city streets. Our walks and hikes range from 2 to 5 hours (our longest being 8.5 miles downhill), and several days will have less physical activity.

PREPARING FOR THIS TRIP

It is important that you realistically assess your physical condition with regard to the demands of this trip. The more well-prepared you are for the activities, the more you will enjoy yourself. As a general guideline, we suggest that you engage in easy to moderate aerobic activities (such as walking, hiking, jogging, or cycling) for at least 30-45 minutes several times a week for 4-6 weeks before the trip. If you live in a flat area, try to incorporate some stairs into your workout, or use a treadmill with varying incline capability (consult your doctor before undertaking any new fitness program). Please contact us if you have any doubts regarding your physical match with this tour.

WEATHER

Argentina is a large country (nearly 2,300 miles long) and its climate varies greatly from region to region. Buenos Aires has a subtropical climate, and summers are generally hot and humid. The low/high temperatures range from 65-85 degrees Fahrenheit, with the potential for heat waves in the low 100s. The warmest months are January, February, and December.

In the mountains and lakes of Bariloche and the southern town of El Calafate, the weather can be summed up in one word—unpredictable—but strong, relentless winds are one constant of life in Patagonia. Light precipitation during the day is not uncommon. Temperatures are cool, ranging from 45 to low 70s degrees Fahrenheit in December.

Please come prepared to walk in rain or shine, packing a range of warm, waterproof layers of clothing, even if the weather appears fine. We will do daily activities as planned, unless weather conditions make it dangerous to do so. You may obtain more detailed weather information at www.weatherbase.com.

TRAVELER'S RESPONSIBILITY

As a trip participant, you have responsibilities to Boundless Journeys, your fellow travelers and guide, and the local people you encounter. This includes understanding and preparing for the conditions described in the itinerary, ensuring it meets your interests and abilities, and following the health and safety guidelines of Boundless Journeys, local authorities, and/or the CDC. At their discretion, a guide may ask a guest to leave the trip if further participation may be detrimental to the individual or other participants.

We strongly urge any guest feeling ill shortly before departure to cancel their trip. To help cover your investment, we highly recommend purchasing travel insurance with supplemental “Cancel for Any Reason” coverage. If you feel unwell during the tour, please immediately inform your guide, who can help take the appropriate next steps. We appreciate your cooperation.

SMALL GROUP TRAVEL

Small group travel affords us the opportunity to seek out the most remote and exotic destinations on the planet. Often we are exploring these locales with just 6-12 guests. The nature of active group travel is such that not all participants have the same ability level or interests. Traveling at a pace that is comfortable for the entire group, with a spirit of flexibility and adventure, are all part of this shared experience.

DRINKS WITH MEALS

At Boundless Journeys we believe group dinners are a time to celebrate our day, while enjoying the best of local cuisine, and good company. In keeping with this spirit, we typically include local beer and wine with group dinners. If you prefer premium wine, or liquor, please feel free to order what you like, and you may settle your tab at the end of the meal.

DRINKING WATER

We provide purified or bottled water on all trips; however, in an effort to reduce waste, we strongly encourage you to bring a water bottle or hydration bag to refill throughout your trip. For water out on the road or trail, we do our best to provide purified water from larger containers to refill your bottles, rather than using many small single-use bottles throughout your trip. This is just one small way we strive to travel more responsibly and we appreciate your efforts in helping us to protect the extraordinary places we visit.

Boundless Journeys has taken the Travelers Against Plastic company pledge to promote sustainable travel and encourage travelers to avoid buying bottled water when they travel. You can take the pledge, too, and learn more about TAP's efforts at www.travelersagainstplastic.org.

CUISINE

Like the country itself, Argentinean cuisine is reflective of its melting pot of cultures. European traditions—primarily Spanish and Italian—are frequently combined with

indigenous influences, both in cooking techniques and the use of local ingredients. Throughout Argentina, food is culturally important, and social gatherings typically occur around a meal, especially Sunday afternoon ‘family dinners.’

If there is one universal feature of Argentinean cuisine, it's beef (or *carne*)—in fact, the country has the highest consumption of red meat in the world. Typically, in the north, cuts of steak and ribs are prepared on the traditional asado barbecue, while in Patagonia, lamb and goat are more common. Sometimes, an entire animal is cooked on an open fire in a technique known as *asado a la estaca*. In both cases, asado meats are typically served along with vegetable sides and a chimichurri sauce of fresh herbs, garlic, and vinegar.

On most menus, you are also likely to find milanesas, or thin cuts of breaded and fried meats, various sausages (like chorizo) and sweet breads, and empanada pastries filled with everything from beef to cheese and sweet corn. Italian transplants, such as pizza and pasta, are also common, while salads and vegetables such as squash, eggplant, tomatoes, lettuce, and onions are typically served as side dishes. For dessert, the nationally-beloved *dulce de leche* (a caramel-like spread made from heated, sweetened milk) is used to flavor cakes, toasted bread, ice cream, and more.
